

Supplies for 2008-2009

Kindergarten

EACH ITEM MUST BE CLEARLY LABELED.

Fiskars Scissors (please label with name)
Paint shirt (adult's old tee shirt)
Gym shoes (separate pair kept in locker)
Kleenex – 1 box (large)
Crackers – 2 boxes, regular size, such as Ritz or graham, not tiny ones
Backpack – large
Markers – 2 boxes (classic colors only, 8 Or 10 count)

Primary

EACH ITEM MUST BE CLEARLY LABELED.

Dry erase markers – 1 package 4pk
Zippered pencil pouches, not plastic, 8" X 10", (smaller sizes will not hold all supplies)
Pencil sharpener with lid - 2
Crayons (**box of 24 only**)
Glue sticks – 8 large
White glue – 1 bottle (4oz)
Scissors (please label with name)
Pencils – 24 (please label with initials)
Pencil erasers – 6
Markers – 12
Colored pencils – 2 packs of 12
Gym shoes (separate pair kept in locker) – Your child should be able to tie the shoes themselves
Smock (old shirts are fine, kept in locker)
Backpack or book bag (**no wheels, no luggage**)
Single-subject spiral notebooks – 4, wide-ruled
Ruler - metric and standard (12 inch)
Plastic folders for homework – 2 (not Trapper Keepers)
Watercolor paints (labeled)
Clorox wipes containers – 3 (Not Baby Wipes)
Kleenex – 1 large box
Grade 1 – 4-pack of household sponges
Grade 2 – Ziplock bags - 2 boxes of gallon-sized, Spanish/English dictionary
Grade 3 – 200 count white **wide-lined** loose-leaf paper – 1 pkg., red pens - 2

These are the only supplies needed. Too many supplies are difficult for primary students to organize.

*Remember for 2nd semester to check with your child for restocking.

(**Plastic or fabric, no binders or
individual folders**)

Hi-Liters – 2 (**yellow only**)

Grade 6 - Compass purchased at school for \$1.25
Grade 6 - Blue or black erasable pens – 3

Highlighters, broad (1 pkg., 4 colors)
Pens (erasable blue or black **and** red)
Whiteout
Scissors – good usable
Loose-leaf paper
Spiral notebooks – 7 - Don't write on them.
One should be a 3-subject one and
one a graph paper notebook.
Index cards (4X6)
Glue stick - 2
Gym bag (shorts, shirt, shoes, deodorant)
Ruler – 12 inches, standard and metric
Protractor
Compass
Kleenex – 2 **large** boxes
Safety glasses – purchase from Mrs. Tourdot
Scientific calculator
Scotch tape

Erasers – 2 (pencil)
Flashdrive – purchase from school. (We will
